With today's Feast of Christ the King we hear the gospel speak about the end times. This is natural as we look to the season of Advent beginning next week and anticipate the birth of Christ in four weeks. This gospel can make us a little uneasy.

But the question we need to ask is "where do you see yourself in this story?"
Do you belong with the helpers on the right?
Do you belong to the non-helpers on the left?

All of us are a little bit of both. There have been times when we have helped the poor, the homeless, the sick and the hungry and there have been other times where we have excused ourselves from helping.

But there are three groups talked about in the story. Those who helped, those who refused to help and those who needed help! These are the people with whom Jesus chose to identify himself. Let's face it; this is where you and I belong. We all need help in one way or another. None of us is self-sufficient. So what Jesus is saying is – put yourself in their shoes and then do what you would have wanted done to you. When we remember to do this then we have no doubt if we belong with those on the left or the right.

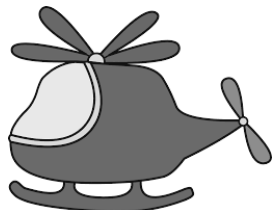
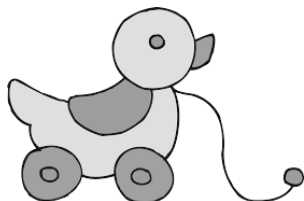

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:

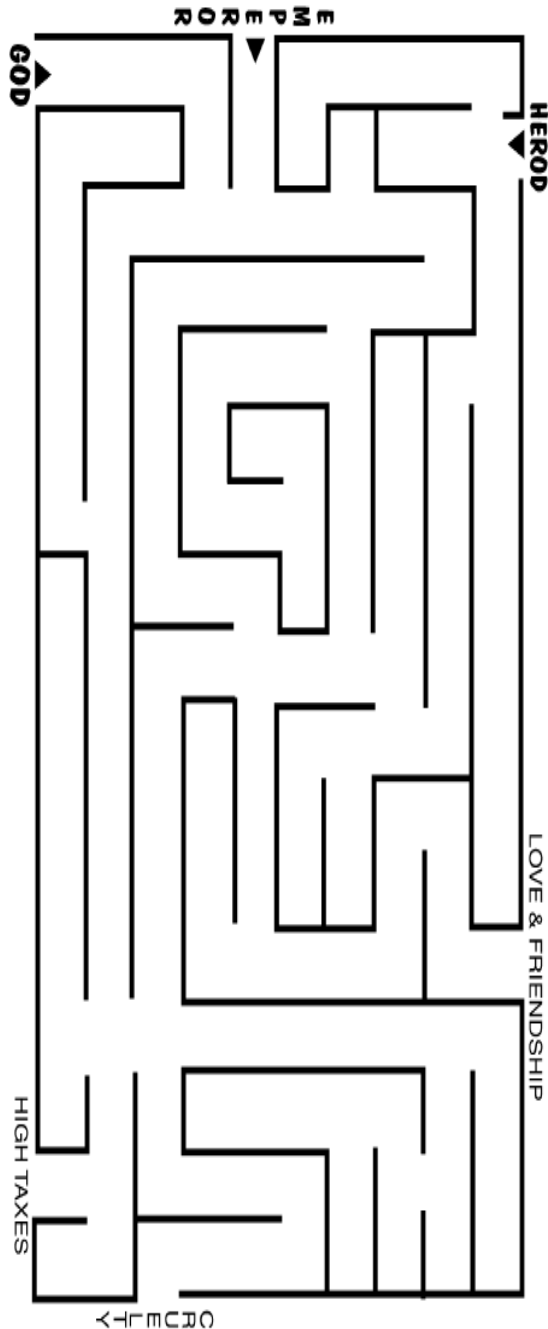
Call Sr. Regina at the Parish Office and make arrangements at least six months in advance. Marriage instructions are required.

Administered upon request to those who are sick. Please contact Sr. Regina at the Parish Office.

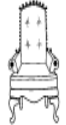
Kid's Corner
