Remember, the cross he carried was not for himself. He carried his cross for everyone else-for Peter and Judas; for the woman at the well and the man born blind; for Pilate, Barabbas, and the revolutionaries crucified with him; for you and for me. We are called to carry crosses for others as well, to ease the burdens on our neighbor. As Jesus gave of himself for our benefit, we are called to give of ourselves for the benefit of those in need. 


