From the Desk of...

Deacon José Zamora, Pastoral Leader

One word appears in all three readings today and it is not ascended or anything having to do with the Ascension. The word is power. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, *"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me"*, enabling him to give them a universal mission to go forth to all nations. In the letter to the Ephesians, Paul (or more likely, someone writing in his name) writes of *"the surpassing greatness of his power"*, which God used to raise Christ from the dead and lift him up to heaven. But the reference to power in the reading from Acts is not describing the Father's or the Son's. Jesus tells his disciples, *"you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you"*. We now have that power as well. It came to us in baptism. We can use this power to carry on the mission that Jesus gave to his disciples, witnessing to him and making disciples of others.

Matthew tells us that when Jesus met the eleven disciples on the mountain, *"they worshiped, but they doubted"*, but he doesn't say what they doubted. Because we are familiar with the story of "doubting Thomas," we may assume they doubted that it was really Jesus. And perhaps they did, for according to Matthew, this was the first time they'd seen him since he had risen from the dead. But perhaps they also doubted themselves. They may have doubted that they would be able to handle Jesus' mission without him. Yes, even the original disciples doubted, whether doubting Jesus' power over death, their own ability to carry on the Christian mission, or those things they could not understand. There is no shame in doubting. It provides an opportunity for faith: for faith in God and faith in ourselves.

In the first chapter of his Gospel, Matthew applies the prophecy of Isaiah to Jesus: *"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"* which means *"God is with us"*. In his final chapter, in fact his final words, Matthew repeats the promise Jesus made to his disciples: *"And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age"*. Jesus' final words to his disciples confirm both his identity and God's promise to us, then, now, and forever. When have I doubted myself and my ability or will to do the mission Jesus calls me to do? How has the power from the Holy Spirit helped me overcome those doubts?



Help Protect the Dignity of Life in Ohio

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that “human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception.” The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. Starting this week, the following materials about the proposed amendment are available in Ohio parishes:






