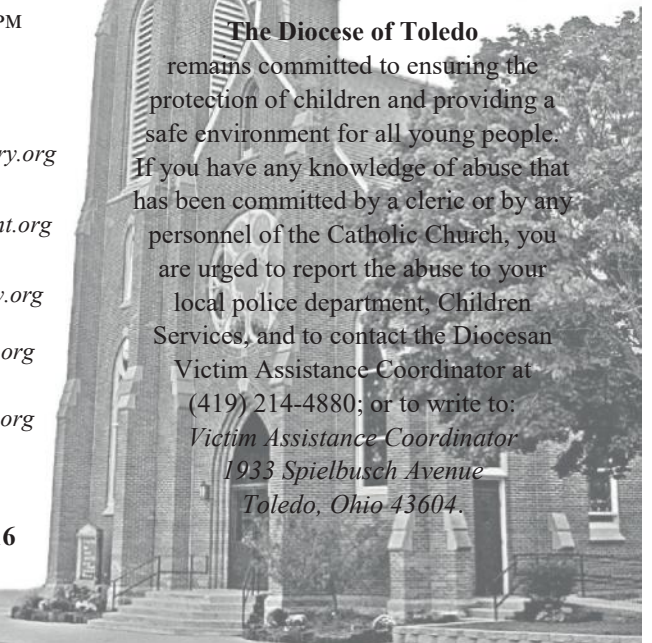

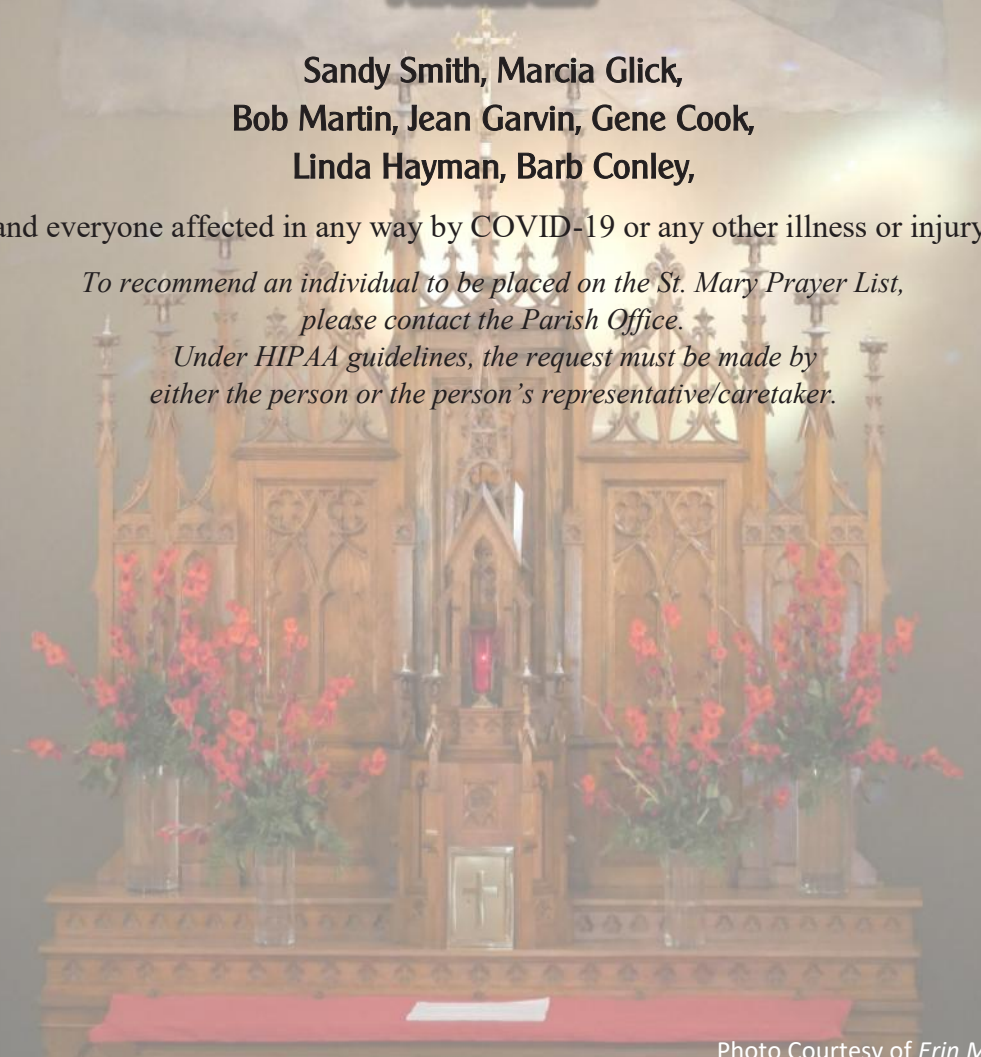

How do we experience death in our lives? Obviously, we will experience it when we die, but we also encounter it when someone close to us dies, for a part of us dies as well. We die a little when we sustain a trauma or are dealt a setback we cannot overcome, especially if we lose heart or lose hope. We may feel dead when we do something we know is wrong, when we realize we've turned our back on God's love. It is then that we need to hear Jesus' words to Jairus: "*Do not be afraid; just have faith*". Jesus has defeated death in all its forms and restored life, life that overcomes death. In any circumstance, may we recognize God's healing love and mercy.

Both Jairus and the woman with hemorrhages take a courageous step in today's Gospel. They both fall on their knees before Jesus, pleading for his healing touch. Each is just desperate enough to do so. Jairus's daughter is near death. The woman has an untreatable illness. Jairus is a synagogue official, a public figure, well-known enough to be mentioned by name, taking a risk that he might lose his position after publicly turning to Jesus. We know the woman does not want to make her request openly, but when Jesus asks, she acknowledges her actions, despite her fear and trembling. Jesus commends their faith, which they have courageously confessed, which has saved them.

As he later did when Lazarus was already in the tomb, Jesus shows that death is not what those without faith think it is. Reminiscent of the naysayers in the story of Lazarus, the people who come out of the house report that the child is dead and that Jairus should leave Jesus alone. After all, death is final and absolute. There is nothing anyone can do. This, of course, is not how Jesus sees death. As Wisdom implies, God made humans and death incompatible. Jesus defeated death once and for all. Today we see that foreshadowed. Though both Lazarus and Jairus's daughter eventually died, we trust that neither of them ever truly tasted death, for Jesus brought them life. How does my faith affect the way I anticipate death? How can it increase my courage? How can I encourage others to keep the faith?




Join us in welcoming RaeAnn Nobles as a new Altar Server for St. Mary! She was installed by Deacon Jose at last weekend's Mass.

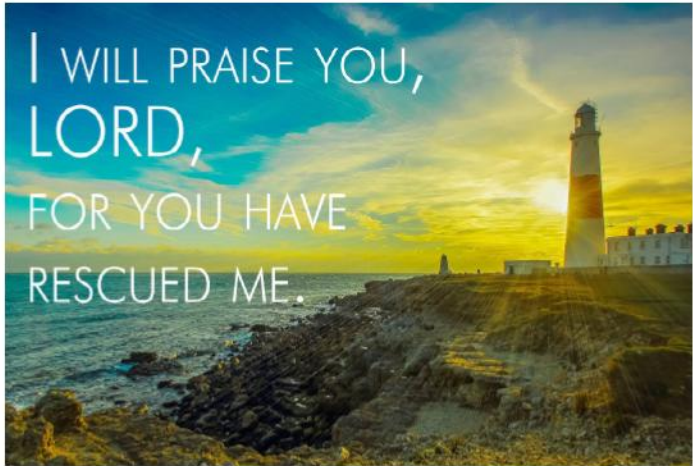
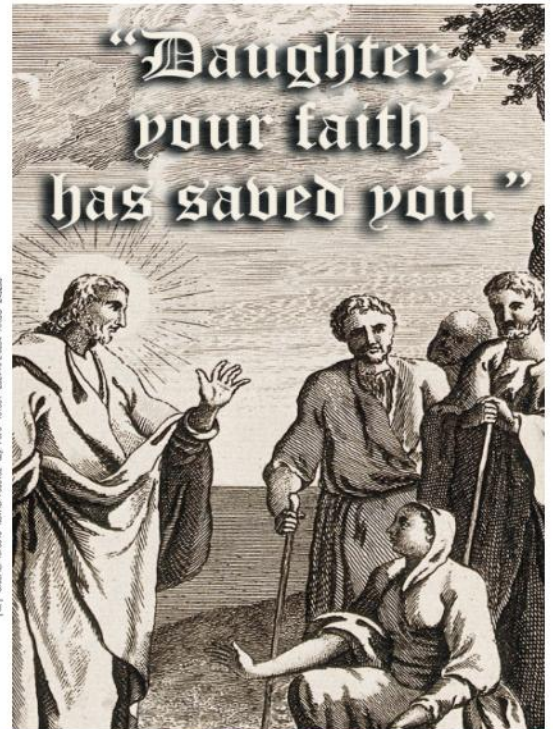

PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION

Father Chris Turner & Father Jacob Livecchi were ordained to the priesthood on Saturday, June 22, 2024. Meet the newest priests of the Diocese of Toledo!

Father Chris Turner



My name is Deacon Chris Turner and my home parish is St. John XXIII in Perrysburg. I am the son of John and Theresa, the brother of Sara, and the uncle of Reese and Lucy. I graduated from Central Catholic High School in 2004 and went to The Ohio State University following that. My plan was to run a large resort or hotel, and as a result, I received a degree in Hospitality Management in 2008. However, God had other plans, and upon graduation he called me to serve in youth ministry instead. I was the youth minister at St. Catherine Parish in Toledo for two years and then moved to Atlanta to become Events Director for Life Teen International. After serving in that role for three years, I missed parish life and became a youth minister again at St. Ann in Marietta, GA. It was at St. Ann that I fell in love with parish life and first felt the call to become a priest. While I loved living in Atlanta, Toledo was always home to me and I knew I needed to go back home to discern my vocation. As a result, I entered seminary formation in 2017 for the Diocese of Toledo. I am forever grateful for my seven years of formation, and I have especially enjoyed the various parish assignments I have received over the years. I am reminded of one of my favorite quotes from St. John Paul II: "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you." I have certainly found this to be true. Jesus and His Church have made my life so much better, and I am so thankful He has called me to serve the Church in this way.

Father Jacob Livecchi



My name is Dcn. Jacob Livecchi and my home parish is St. Ignatius in Oregon. I grew up in a large Catholic family of ten kids (I am number five). I was homeschooled and after graduating from high school in 2015, I went to the University of Toledo. After one year of college where I studied visual arts, I felt the Lord calling me to something more. I felt within my heart the Lord calling me to discern the priesthood. So, I entered college seminary at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus studying philosophy. I finished my Bachelor of Philosophy and graduated in 2019 from Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. I then began my theological studies at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. I graduated in June 2022 with a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University. I spent my internship year serving at three parishes: St. John the Evangelist in Delphos, St. John the Baptist in Landeck, and St. Patrick in Spencerville. At the end of my internship year, I was ordained a transitional deacon. Last year I returned to Rome to complete my last year of seminary formation.

As I near priesthood ordination I am filled with excitement and gratitude. I am honored and humbled by what God has done in my life with my simple yes to follow his will. I entered seminary not convinced I wanted to be a priest, today I could never imagine doing anything else. I am also aware that I am not approaching this great sacrament on my own strength. I am able to approach the sacrament priesthood because of all the prayers, support, and formation that I have received from all of you, but most of all because of God's great grace.

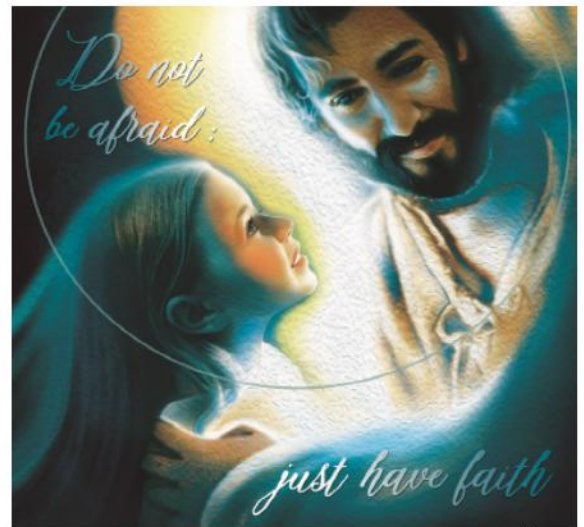

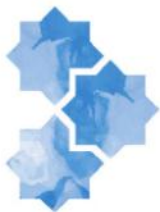
