Clyde St. Mary Catholic Church

This account of Jesus changing water into wine is found only in John's Gospel. John referred to Jesus' miracles as signs, as a way for him to reveal his glory and a way for those who observe them to receive the gift of faith. But transforming water into wine was much more than a way to ensure that the wine would not run out at this couple's wedding banquet. It foreshadows one of his final signs, which he performs at the Last Supper when he transforms bread into his Body and wine into his Blood. By commanding the disciples to continue to do this in his memory, he ensures that it is his Blood that we receive at the Eucharistic banquet each time the Eucharist is celebrated. Just as the joy of the guests at the wedding banquet in Cana was not allowed to run out, the joy we share in the Eucharistic banquet will also last forever.

We celebrated Epiphany two Sundays ago, but each of the Gospels since then has also featured epiphanies. An epiphany is a sudden manifestation or revelation of something that had been unknown. Yes, one occurred when the magi found the newborn king in a humble stable. But another occurred at Jesus' baptism, which we heard last week, when the Father's voice was heard saying, "You are my beloved Son. And today we hear the first of his miracles, which opened the eyes of his disciples to his power and glory. As we begin the year, we recall how Jesus was revealed again and again as the Son of God.

Saint Paul goes into detail about the different kinds of spiritual gifts the Holy Spirit shares with us. He also mentions the different workings God produces in us and the different forms of service we do for the Lord. Paul, of course, serves as an apostle to the Gentiles, journeying, preaching, and writing to Christian communities around the Mediterranean that he himself founded. Others serve as bishops, presbyters, deacons, or elders, serving their sisters and brothers by celebrating the sacraments, teaching the faith, or distributing food and clothing to those in need. For Paul, the gifts of the Spirit and our service to the Lord are intertwined. Name one spiritual gift that I can identify in myself. How can I use that gift in service of the Lord?

It is that time of the year...a reminder as we go into the winter months

Level 1 - A Level One Snow Emergency means that roads (township and county, mainly secondary) are hazardous with the possibility of blowing and drifting snow.

Level 2 - A Level Two Snow Emergency means that roads are hazardous (including primary roads) with blowing and drifting snow a possibility. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be on these roadways. Employees should contact their employers to see if they should report to work. **Motorists should use extreme caution.**

Level 3 - A Level Three Snow Emergency means that roads are closed to all non-essential personnel. No one should be out during these conditions unless it is absolutely necessary to travel. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Those traveling on any roadway in the county may subject themselves to citation or arrest. **NO MASS SERVICES**

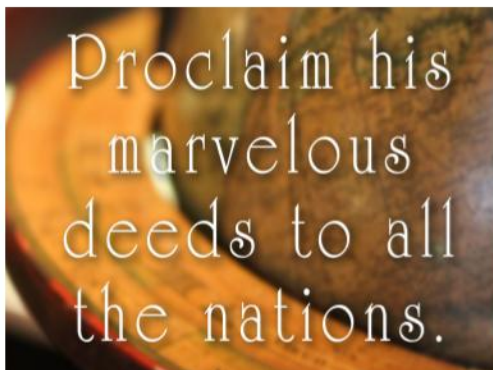
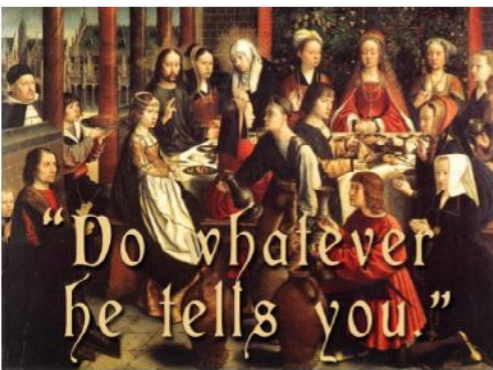
