Saul chases David into the desert because he is consumed with jealousy of the young giant slayer. David has every reason to fear for his life, seeing an army of thousands in pursuit, led by a king who kept a spear right next to him as he slept. But given the opportunity to kill Saul while he sleeps, David elects to spare his life. He tells his comrade Abishai that he will not kill Saul because Saul has been anointed by God. Jesus takes it one step further in the Gospel, teaching his disciples to love their enemies, whether or not they have been anointed. Our enemies may not be anointed by God, but no matter who they are, they were created in the image of God and are children of God. We have no right to hate or fight a fellow child of God.

Saint Paul puts it all together for the Corinthians. In speaking of the first Adam, who was made a living being on earth by God, and the last Adam, Christ, who comes from heaven and gives life, Paul writes, “*Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one*”. As we now resemble Adam in our humanity, one day we will resemble Christ in his glory.

Putting the lessons from today’s Gospel into practice is a major challenge. It is tempting to fight back, to be judgmental, to condemn those who do not agree with us. After all, isn’t that what we see online or on television, or practice ourselves on social media or among our family and friends? The key to meeting this challenge is to become as selfless as possible. We must overcome our self centeredness and choose self-sacrifice, as Jesus himself did. He freely gave his healing power knowing he could not be repaid. He lived without possessions, trusting in God’s generosity. He forgave his enemies, even from the cross. It helps to see life as a collaboration, with all God’s children growing and developing in harmony, not as a competition, where we fear that we will not get or keep what is our fair share. Which is the most difficult challenge for me: turning the other cheek when I have been hurt or wronged, refraining from judging others, or giving without repayment? How will I change my thinking and my behavior?

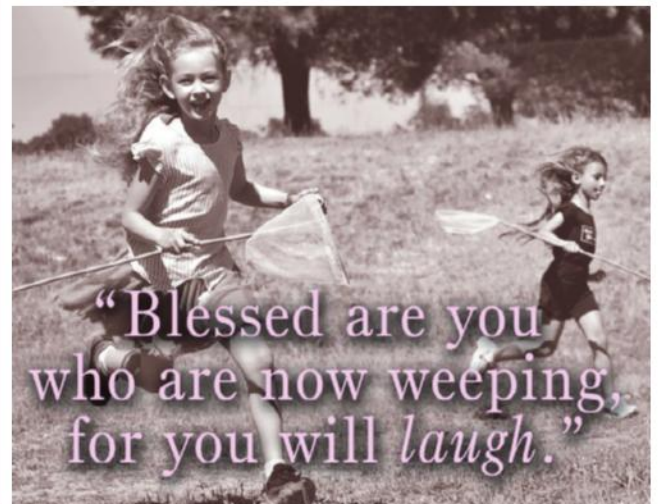

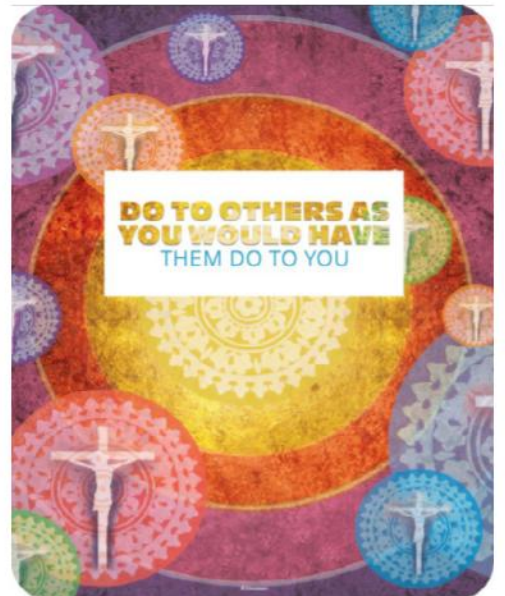
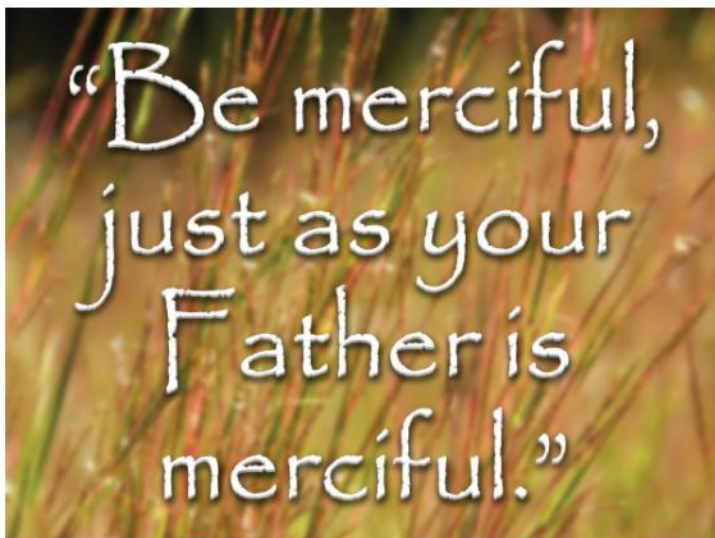
